Alex Verwey is committed to sharing the Gospel and doing whatever he can to help people come one step closer to putting their trust in the Lord. He has played a vital role in spearheading the Café and Kids Club ministries, which have reached many who have never attended church.

Alex also has a burden to help the struggling churches of Japan become spiritually-thriving centers of hope. He has helped to provide such churches with workers and resources, which has served to build up and empower them, so that they can grow as the body of Christ and reach the unsaved.

As the Lord provided dedicated English teachers, Alex has been coordinating the English Evangelism Program to help churches reach their communities with the Gospel. About 300 students now frequent these churches and hear a Bible talk each week.

As we assessed the needs of the Japanese church, we have found that they are in great need of assistance with social media and the development of media content, which would help them be more effective in reaching out to their communities. Alex has coordinated the efforts of a talented team to develop such content and create new websites.

There are very few churches in rural Japan. As Christian workers have shared their vision to establish churches in such areas, Alex has mobilized teams of workers and volunteers to help with this church planting effort. Such efforts have included holding evangelistic events, distributing tracts, developing advertising, creating media content and launching websites.

As natural disasters struck, Alex has led many teams to affected areas to help with the disaster relief efforts. Tracts have been distributed and media content was created to raise awareness and mobilize Christian volunteers. Many unbelievers have found a connection with their local church for the first time as a result.

As we carry on this work, we are encouraged to know that many Christians have been called to partner with us. Their faithful prayers and support have continued to help us make a difference in the lives of many.

Pray that the Lord would continue to clearly lead, and give us wisdom and discernment as we are presented with many opportunities to serve — so that some may be saved (1 Cor. 9:22).

It was July 25, 2004 when the doorbell rang at the crack of dawn! Neil and Peggy Verwey's three grand-children, Jesse, Alex and Chris, were standing at their door. "We are on our way to a youth camp," they said. "Could you please pray for us?" "How good it was to pray with them that the glory of God would shine through their lives!" Neil shared.

Most mornings, David and Sue's three children would *fly* down a steep mountain road to school on their bicycles, trying to beat each other. When Alex was 12, he was racing around the curves at *breakneck* speed when he lost control and slid under an on-coming car head first! The car stopped

just as he slid under it. His helmet was so tightly wedged under the car that he first had to unfasten it before he could crawl out! Miraculously, Alex only sustained some scrapes and bruises! *For he shall give his angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways* (Psalm 91:11).

The driver's wife, Mrs. Tanaka and their daughter came with a large gift in hand to express their sincere apologies. This would be unthinkable in the West, considering that the incident was entirely Alex's fault! After exchanging gifts and apologies, they eagerly listened as we shared of the hope that we had in our Creator God and invited them to church.

The Lord taught Alex and his brothers that life was not just about beating each other to school at all costs, but rather about being a witness to others and glorifying God.

"When I told them that I had been praying for them for three months, they were all smiles and said "Ureshi!" ("We are so glad!")

"I am so thankful that my God is the God of second chances! Hallelujah!!" Alex shared.

We live in a time when people are intensely independent and selfish. If we are not careful, we can easily be swept away by the temptation to live life in such a way that it only brings glory to ourselves.

Their heart's desire is to continue the work that was started by Neil and Peggy — to see souls saved!
