CORONAVIRUS OPPORTUNITIES

Japan Mission has faced many challenges over the years. However, the global corona virus pandemic presented us with extraordinary challenges.

Many of the methods used to reach people through social interaction suddenly ground to a halt, as the entire population of Japan was encouraged to self-isolate. Efforts to reach and befriend non-Christians through meetings, English classes and the Café ministry were all affected. However, the *Fountain of Joy tract* continued to be published and distributed to many thousands each month.

The needs of those who surrounded us have been great. Telephone counselors were overwhelmed, as people phoned in and spoke of committing suicide because they had lost their jobs and could not pay their bills. Some were even talking about family suicide. People were reminded of how fragile life is, as they witnessed the collapse of the material things in which they had placed their hopes in. We have seen the Lord at work in the hearts of many who were forced to

reevaluate the things in which they placed their confidence in. As a result, some decided to accept the Lord Jesus as Saviour and other rededicated their lives to the Lord!

God has been showing us that He is sovereign and can accomplish His work, despite the difficult circumstances. When social gatherings were restricted because people were asked to shelter-in-place, the Lord led our workers to stay in touch with many through online Bible lessons and English classes.

Many unsaved students gathered to see and speak to each other through their devices. The minister of the church in their community also joined in to interact with the students and give a short Bible talk. These online classes helped ministers stay connected with students during the months they were isolated.

One encouraging outcome has been that many churches started to stream their messages over the internet. This has enabled people to listen and participate in the privacy of their homes – thereby reaching many who would otherwise not have attended church.

One English student has been attending class at a church for over 10 years, but only attended one worship service in all that time. Due to COVID-19, this church started to live-stream their worship services and he started to listen each week! While talking with one of our workers this elderly man shared, “I am Buddhist, but ever since I started listening online it’s really made me think ...”

Another elderly Christian lady was bedridden and could not attend church for several years. She was overjoyed when the services started to be streamed online. Now she can regularly take part in many of the church services!

DEDICATED WORKERS

Key factors have enabling Japan Mission to meet the needs of those in surrounding communities during the pandemic. Those who prayed faithfully and gave sacrificial financial

contributions during this critical time were a great encouragement to us. The Holy Spirit also granted wisdom and a steadfast resolve to our dedicated team of workers, as they were faced with some extraordinary decisions.

As embassies encouraged their citizens to return to their home countries and air travel was about to be shut down, we asked workers if they felt the need to return to their home countries. We warned them that we were entering an unprecedented time, and that Japan Mission may even experience a severe shortage of funds in the coming months, as banking and mail services were likely to be disrupted.

After prayerful consideration, each worker communicated their intent to stay and serve – even if there may be a shortage of funds to pay salaries. The Lord has since faithfully provided for the finances and the work continues! We praise the Lord for dedicated workers and many faithful supporters who stood with us!

Initially, COVID-19 made it difficult to hold any type of gathering. Lock-down requirements severely hampered the normal Easter celebrations. Easter was a valuable time for all of us to silently reflect on God at work in the hearts of those around us. ***Be still, and know that I am God*** (Psalm 46:10).

As we prayerfully sought the Lord for guidance, He moved in the hearts of our workers to combine their efforts to develop a new way to reach out. Our media team used their technical knowledge to set up the computers and cameras, and coach teachers, pastors and students through the process of how to connect and interact while online. Our English teachers also adapted their lesson plans and teaching styles to fit the situation.

Together, the Lord enabled us to seize this opportunity, which provided some unique chances to influence and encourage those who were feeling lonely and overwhelmed by many uncertainties.

LONG-TERM PRESENCE

Japan Mission has been called to share the Gospel by using various methods that the Lord indicated, while establishing a long-term presence – in a country where the people's minds

Some have asked, "Since Japan is a difficult mission field where results are so few, who don't you work elsewhere where people are more receptive to the Gospel?"

We can relate to Paul, who experienced many hardships when he said, **Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart** (2 Cor. 4:1). We strive to follow the method put forth by Paul when he said, **By setting forth the Truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God** (2 Cor. 4:2).

Many have been saved and much fruit has been realized as a result of our vision to establish a long-term presence in Japan.

Another benefit derived from maintaining a long-term presence has been that we have been able to build a good rapport with numerous churches across Japan. As a result, it has been easy for workers of Japan Mission to go into most regions to do evangelism and offer disaster relief, while working in close cooperation with local churches.

As the coronavirus pandemic has played out, the Lord reminded us once again of how important it is to continue this long-term presence. COVID-19 was not the kind of disaster where aid agencies could mobilize and travel to Japan to offer help. Most were forced into a lock-down and international travel became next to impossible.

It was during this time that workers of Japan Mission had the opportunity to interact with hundreds of unsaved students, with whom they already had a good rapport. Ministers were also heartened as they participated in the process of sharing the Gospel and inspiring students in their communities.

Many who faced loneliness and isolation have been influenced for the Lord. **Pray** with us for the seeds that have been sown and the salvation of souls!
