"I was then faced with some very serious decisions in my life. The culmination of the stress and lack of meaning to it all led me to cry out to God saying, *'God, I need you to help me, I don't know what to do!'*

CALLING TO JAPAN

“While in college, I received a certification in Animation and worked in this field for 3 years,” Callum shared. “I then worked in videography and marketing for 5 years. During this time, I became involved with a youth group and worked as a volunteer for the media department of my church.

“While serving on the missions committee, I was introduced to missions. My first experience was building houses with our students in Mexico in 2019, while documenting our time there.

“We had a number of missionaries visit our church from various countries, so we filmed and interviewed them to present their needs to our church, as well as to provide videos they could share with their other supporters.

“It was during this time that Aaron Wilson, a former missionary of Japan Mission, shared that Japan Mission could use someone with my skills. I then went to Japan to work as a volunteer. After seeing this ministry and engaging with the people and the culture, I found myself drawn to serve in Japan.

“After returning to Canada, I started to use online language exchanges to practice Japanese and help Japanese with their English learning. I had no idea how the Lord would lead me to work in Japan, but soon after Japan Mission informed me that they were looking for a teacher for their English evangelism program. They were also looking for someone to help in their media ministry.

I was excited for this opportunity to continue working with the team and connect with the Japanese students while sharing the Gospel!

This challenged me to get my TEFL certification.

ENGLISH & MEDIA MINISTRY

After doing some volunteer work for Japan Mission, Callum Kyllonen joined as a full-time member in January 2024. As an English Evangelism teacher, he goes out to various churches each week to teach English. Each class ends with a short Bible talk. Callum has also played a key role in producing high quality media, that draws people to churches and promotes their activities.

Most Japanese churches struggle to maintain engaging websites and don't have a welcome video for newcomers because they lack the resources and know-how to develop these tools. Japan Mission is committed to working with local churches to create media tools that help them communicate the message of Hope to their local communities.

JAPAN MISSION CALLED TO SERVE

Japan Mission seeks to evangelize the unsaved and assist the Bible-believing churches of Japan. Most churches are small and in need of assistance with literature, evangelistic programs, media development and help from well-qualified workers.

This ministry is interdenominational, not planting churches, but rather linking those reached through various avenues of ministry to already-existing churches.

Japan Mission has about 40 people in its family of workers, 20 of whom minister in Japan, and about 20 representatives in various countries who play a crucial role by helping Japan Mission stay in contact with prayer partners and supporters in Australia, Canada, South Africa, the UK and the USA.

Faithful co-workers play a vital role through teaching, preaching, evangelism, counseling, Bible study, correspondence and the publication of literature. Japan Mission also works in partnership with key associates who have been making an impact in the lives of many for the Gospel in East Asia.
