“As we prayed, the Lord began to speak to us more specifically about full-time missionary service,” Ed shared.

“We were challenged to think of the ways in which God had orchestrated the events of our lives, and then consider where that life experience intersected with the need for the Gospel specifically amongst an unreached people group.

“As we prayed, we sensed that the Holy Spirit was leading us to Japan. We then started to connect with a large number of missionaries and mission agencies with ministries in Japan.

“Starting in 2019, we made a number of trips to Japan for both work and ministry exploration.

“Just as we were gaining momentum and planning a ministry **vision trip** in Spring 2020, the COVID pandemic put a stop to our plans, but not His!

“It was during those three years we remained in Texas that He sorted, shifted, and shored up His vision, plan and preordained path that He had prepared in advance for us to walk in!

“In January 2023, we made another trip to many parts of Japan to visit 17 different mission agencies and churches.

We met over 60 people in a little over three weeks. We were truly blessed to see the many ways in which God was working amongst the people and country of Japan.

“It was during this trip that we heard the clear voice of the Lord guiding us to apply for service with Japan Mission.

“The motto of the work of Japan Mission is **Called to Serve**.

We found that this mission’s ministry goals were in alignment with ours,” Toby shared.

“Because we are born again, our hearts desire is to love, support and serve the Japanese church. We are also compelled to love and serve the people of Japan who do not yet know our precious Lord as Savior.

“We are humbled to heed the call to this ministry, where it is the desire of God’s heart for those who do not yet know Him to finally hear His voice and say, **Yes, Lord. I will follow You!**

MINISTRY IN JAPAN

Ed and Toby Thomas joined Japan Mission as full-time mission workers in January 2024 from Houston, Texas.

After a short time in language school, they started to serve in the **English Evangelism Program**. They have had the opportunity to share the Word and God’s love with many through this ministry. **Pray** for wisdom and strength for Ed and Toby, and that the students would come to a full knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Because of Ed’s previous work, he has built up an extensive network of friends who are medical professionals and business people in various parts of Japan. He has had

regular opportunities to cultivate these relationships and witness to them. **Pray** that the Holy Spirit would move in their hearts.

The Lord moved in Ed and Toby’s hearts to develop a **Hospitality Ministry**. God has provided them with access to a three-bedroom apartment, a four-bedroom house and a garden, complete with a pizza oven and BBQ facilities - where they invite many to relax and experience Christian hospitality.

This Hospitality Ministry recently took on an added dimension with the addition of a new **Homestay Ministry**. Many are invited to spend extended periods of time to experience daily Christian living and hospitality, while being immersed in a different culture where people converse mostly in English.

Brochures have been made and short-term visitors of all ages are coming. This outreach has provided unique opportunities to share the Gospel with many.

Pray that people would be receptive to the Gospel and that the seeds of God’s Word would be fall on **good soil** and flourish.

CAYA MINISTRIES

In Japanese society, there are few places where people are accepted **just as they are**, but that is what the grace of God does for us. It embraces us **just as we are**.

CAYA CAFÉ is part of this ministry. Each week, on Saturday afternoons, up to 40 visitors come from the community to join us at Japan Mission for fun and fellowship over a cup of coffee or tea.

CAYA ENGLISH is another part of this ministry for adults. As we befriend people, they join the English classes and come to the English camps and hear more about God’s Word.
